

Rite of Election - OCIA

This weekend our catechumens and candidates will be sent forth from the Masses they attend to Bishop Persico, who will greet them and proclaim them ready to be received into the Catholic Church. Bishop Persico is not able to be with each parish for the Easter Vigil, so this is the moment when catechumens and candidates receive his blessing.

The Rite of Election is a Lenten liturgy in which the Church formally recognizes catechumens (non-baptized) as elect, preparing them for Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist. The Rite of Election marks the transition from the catechumenate to the period of purification and enlightenment, signaling the final stages of preparation for the Sacraments. It is a public acknowledgement that God has called these individuals and that the Church affirms their readiness to enter full communion.

The rite emphasizes both God's election and the catechumens' and candidates' free response to faith and commitment.

Being a willing servant is different from being a slave.



"One does not live on bread alone."


As we approach Lent 2026, let us be **"led by the Spirit"** to discover new ways to be moral guides for our children.
